A New Adventure!

Something a bit different for our guild — a "PIZZA BOX" style exchange! We're calling it the "Cloud 9 Challenge."

9months 9patterns 9 inch blocks

It's free to join in; just pull the fabrics (two yards background, two yards focus, plus a few extra fabrics to use in your blocks) from your stash for your box. For this guild activity, Paula Klaassen will be the "quilting police," checking for correct size blocks and timely exchanges. More detailed info will be included in each box.

If you need additional information, have questions, or cannot make a specific meeting, contact Paula Klaassen, paulinesgirlok@gmail.com for drop off and pick up alternatives.



IN A NUTSHELL . . . DO THIS:

- 1. January bring your fabrics to guild meeting and sign up
- 2. February pick up first box, take it home, make block using those fabrics
- 3. March, April, May, June,
 July, August, Sept bring box
 (including the block you made) back
 to guild meeting, pick up different
 box, repeat
- 4. October all boxes must be returned by October guild meeting
- 5. November all boxes will be distributed back to the participants

Please consider joining us!

It will be fun and a learning experience!

Plus, we need at least 20 participants

to make it work.

2025 Donation Quilt / Starting in January...

The theme for this year's donation quilt is

Think birds, butterflies, insects, mythical creatures, planes, and, certainly, angels — anything with wings!



Packets will be available to you (at no cost) during the January and February guild meetings. If you think you will need more fabric than what's provided, a supply of extra batiks will also be available.

Using the beautiful fabrics left over from last year's gorgeous quilt, your packet includes several pieces of fabric and the guidelines. Not everyone will receive the exact same fabric. Feel free to add blue, green or yellow batiks from your stash to create your block. You don't need to use all the provided fabrics, but please do not add that perfect hot pink you just love.

For an embroidered block, blue, green or black are always good as main colors.


The finished donation quilt will use the blocks that most closely resemble the **Wings** theme.

Have fun and return your block to Paula Klaassen at or before the March guild meeting.

Unfinished blocks will be 8.5" and/or 12.5" — 8" and 12" finished:

- * All 12" blocks will be pieced, with a pattern provided in their packets.
- *All 8" blocks can be pieced, appliquéd, embroidered, or a combination of techniques.

Use any "wings-inspired" pattern, or no pattern at all (for those of us who work a little more loosely)! If you would like for us to provide a block pattern (so you don't have to look for one), a variety will be available when you pick up your packets, or contact Paula Klaassen (paulinesgirlok@gmail.com) and she will get a pattern to you.



Later this year, blocks not featured in the quilt will be grouped and given to a member whose name is chosen in a drawing. If you contribute a block, your name is in!

BOUTIQUE TABLE


We should have a great selection of goodies for the January meeting. This thread and lace will be there along with fabric, wool squares, and sew many more things that have already been donated.

We look forward to continually filling those closets with the awesome quilts our guild members so creatively put together for the kids of all ages!!

Our December workday was again very productive with prepping quilts for quilting and binding, and we delivered **69** quilts, **232** receiving blankets/burp cloths/changing pads, **20** drawstring tote bags during December. <u>THANK YOU</u> from all of our agencies!!! Our current team welcomes our new chairs, Ann and Pete Olson, and looks forward to working hard again next year to distribute as many quilts and other items as we possibly can! Keep on sewing, ladies!!

Thank you SO very much for your kindness and compassion for those less fortunate in our community. We hope you will continue to make pillowcases, which we donate to *Ryan's Case for Smiles*, who delivers them to The Children's Hospital at Saint Frances in Tulsa. And, of course, quilts, quilts and more quilts! ©

American Patchwork and Quilting Created a Quilters Bucket List

A new year is the perfect time to set new goals, use their list or make one of your own. Follow the embedded links in this list for ideas, how-tos, and free patterns.

- 1. Use acrylic or paper templates to piece a block.
- 2. Make and donate a pillowcase to charity.
- 3. Organize your fabrics and scraps.
- 4. Change your needle/replace your rotary cutter blade/clean your machine.
- 5. Identify a problem area in your sewing space and find a solution.
- 6. Attend a quilt guild meeting in your area.
- 7. Sew accurately using foundation piecing.
- 8. For one week, set aside 20 minutes a day to sew.
- 9. Sew a quilt using only your scraps and stash.
- 10. Get topsy-turvy with curved piecing.
- 11. Take a quilting class (in person or online).
- 12. Read the pattern completely before starting the project.
- 13. Submit a reader tip to our magazine at apqtips@meredith.com.
- 14. Take your handwork to a surprising location.
- 15. Join a fun quilt-along.
- 16. Creatively piece your quilt backing.
- 17. Go on a quilt retreat. (Find our ultimate quilt retreat packing list <u>here</u>.)
- 18. Machine-sew a decorative stitch sample.
- 19. <u>Label a quilt.</u> (Don't forget your name and the date!)
- 20. Take a picture/journal about each quilt you make this year.
- 21. Assemble a pincushion.
- 22. Sew a quilt for charity.
- 23. Meet your quilting hero (in person or online).
- 24. Make a quilt using only solids.
- 25. Slow down and hand-quilt.
- 26. Make a bed-size quilt, then snuggle under it.
- 27. Attend a national quilt show.

- 28. Read your sewing machine manual.
- 29. Change out all your quilts for a new season.
- 30. Visit a new quilt shop (with your best quilting buddies).
- 31. Try English paper piecing.
- 32. Explore a quilt museum.
