


LECTURE: Modern Reimagined Dresden's

My journey with the Dresden block into the Modern quilt world, art quilts and publishing. How do you go from a quilt you made to a pattern to a book? How I have learned how versatile this shape is.

Candyce's Quilt Bio Candyce has been fascinated with fabric, and quilting since the age of nine, when she took her first sewing class and won a prize for her corduroy jumper and print shirt with a necktie. She saw an ancestor's quilt in the Smithsonian at age thirteen, and was hooked. She taught herself to quilt from books and used cardboard templates and scissors to make her first quilt, a Log Cabin. Many of her works have a "tradition-with-a-twist" quality, and although she relies on inspirations from generations gone by, they also have a contemporary feel.

Candyce has taught quilting for more than twenty-five years and loves teaching and exploring with students as much as creating.

She published her first pattern on the Dresden quilt (of course!) in 2015 and her second in 2018. Candyce's book Dresden Quilt Blocks Reimagined was published in 2019.

We have 3-yard fabric bundles to use with your favorite 3-yard pattern, simple kits to make quilt tops, Habitat Quilt kits to add sashing and outer border to completed house blocks. A variety of pillowcase kits, quilts to be quilted and quilts to be bound. Take one or more project(s). Work on them at home or at your favorite sew day. We are grateful for every helping hand involved in doing the part you enjoy best.

Our H & H workdays in August are Saturday the 2nd and Monday the 25th, from 9-2 pm at Spirit Life Church, 5345 S Peoria Ave., Tulsa. Use the door on the north side of the church, in the corner of the parking lot by the trees and shrubbery, and a sign that reads "Destination Kids" above the doors. Please call Ann or Lynessa and someone will open the door for you. We have an elevator to haul wagons and bags to and from our work rooms. If you want a wagon to come down and help load in your things, please let us know when you call.

We have a great team of quilters, and all are welcome to join us. Come help us process finished quilts, prep and get kits ready for piecing, quilting and binding. You can browse the fabric supply we have, build your own kit from the fabrics and precuts we have available. Take some home to make quilt tops for Hearts and Hands. You can come and pick up projects on our workday to work on at home or you can stay and sew there or help work on the needs of that day. We have sewing machines, so you don't have to bring yours. Bring a lunch and work with us, we are there from 9 am to 2 pm. We enjoy greeting and meeting new faces and welcoming them into our team! It's a pleasure working alongside such wonderful quilters! We look forward to seeing you all at one of our workdays or both and the next guild meeting!



The Quilter's Apprentice by Jennifer Chiaverini – A timeless tale of family and forgiveness, where quilting becomes a bridge between generations.

- The Persian Pickle Club by Sandra Dallas A Depressionera tale of secrets and solidarity among a group of Kansas auilters.
- How to Make an American Quilt by Whitney Otto This novel mirrors the structure of a quilt, interlacing the stories of eight women in a California quilting circle through their contributions to a wedding quilt and personal tales. Quilting becomes a powerful metaphor for how individual lives marked by joys and sorrows—are pieced together into a tapestry of shared experience and female connection
- **Alias Grace** by Margaret Atwood A historical novel, where quilting becomes a striking motif for memory and identity as Grace Marks—a servant convicted of murder—recounts her fragmented past while piecing together symbolic quilt patterns. These designs mirror the ambiguity of her story, leaving readers to question whether she's assembling truth or a masterfully stitched lie.
- Confessions from the Quilting Circle by Maisey Yates Three sisters reconnect through a mysterious quilt and the legacy of their grandmother's craft.
- **Prayers for Sale** by Sandra Dallas In a 1930's Colorado mining town, quilting serves as both a catalyst for friendship and a vessel for storytelling, as eighty-six-year-old Hennie Comfort shares life memories with a young newlywed through her craft. Each quilt stitches together love, loss, and resilience, preserving generations of women's wisdom in fabric and friendship.
- The Runaway Quilt by Jennifer Chiaverini Sylvia uncovers family secrets through a quilt tied to the Underground Railroad.
- **The Lover's Knot** by Clare O'Donohue A cozy mystery where quilting and romance unravel secrets in a small town.
- The Last Runaway by Tracy Chevalier Quilting becomes a profound symbol of both refuge and resistance as Honor Bright, a transplanted English Quaker, finds purpose amid 1850s Ohio. Through secret patterns stitched into quilts, Chevalier links domestic craft to the Underground Railroad, revealing Honor's quiet defiance and moral bravery
- The Cross-Country Quilters by Jennifer Chiaverini Five women from different walks of life unite through a quilting challenge that transforms their futures.
