

Candyce's Quilt Bio Candyce has been fascinated with fabric, and quilting since the age of nine, when she took her first sewing class and won a prize for her corduroy jumper and print shirt with a necktie. She saw an ancestor's quilt in the Smithsonian at age thirteen, and was hooked. She taught herself to quilt from books and used cardboard templates and scissors to make her first quilt, a Log Cabin. Many of her works have a "tradition-with-a-twist" quality, and although she relies on inspirations from generations gone by, they also have a contemporary feel.

Candyce has taught quilting for more than twenty-five years and loves teaching and exploring with students as much as creating.

She published her first pattern on the Dresden quilt (of course!) in 2015 and her second in 2018. Candyce's book Dresden Quilt Blocks Reimagined was published in 2019.

Their entry won the **Storyteller Award**, which came with a **\$50** gift certificate to ByAnnie.com.






FROM THE LIBRARIAN

The first 5 years I quilted I did all my quilts on my domestic machine with a simple stipple stitch or meander. We have several books that are really good and teach you the basics of quilting your own quilts on your domestic machine. It doesn't matter how big your machine throat space is you can do it!! Besides most of the quilts for Hearts and Hands are smaller quilts anyway.

GCQG Mission Statement






