

FROM THE LIBRARIAN



Sharp scissors are a must-have for sewing because they ensure clean, precise cuts. Dull scissors can fray fabric edges, making sewing more challenging and leading to uneven seams. A sharp blade glides through fabric effortlessly, preventing jagged edges and reducing strain on your hands.

A quick test: Try cutting a single sheet of tissue paper.

If the cut isn't clean or smooth, it's time for sharpening!


